Y's Men International News

One of the topics discussed at the recent International Council Meeting in Australia was the lack of publicity for Y'smen International. A task force has been appointed to work with a PR company to conduct a review of the image of Y'smen, Y's Menettes and Y's Youth. A budget of about \$29,000 was authorized for this purpose.

US Area News

AP **Fred Leonard** announced at the recent International Council Meeting that, given the decline in membership in the Area, the primary thrust during his next two years will be to reverse the trend through coordinated extension and membership conservation efforts utilizing Area and Regional Extension and MC RSDs and District Governors. This will be accomplished by following through on YMCA contacts, training for all levels from club member to ASD with special emphasis on District Governors and continuing evaluation and modification of club structure, organization and culture. He also expressed a long term goal of encouraging involvement of clubs and members beyond the local level in Y'smen International.

Hawai'i Region

Clubs should be well underway in planning for the 72nd Regional Convention and should be preparing preliminary reports for the Regional Cabinet and Convention Steering Committee meetings on November 24, 2007. Central is responsible for the general program of the convention.

Metro District
