Brother Club News

March is International Brother Club (IBC) month in the Hawaii Region. The RSD (Regional Service Director) for IBC is **James Chong** (Nu'uauu), the ASD (Area Service Director) is **Hany Girgis** of Kankakee (Illinois) Y Service Club while the ISD (International Service Director) is **Lambert Okure** of Jinja (Uganda) Y service Club. The goal of IBC is "to join in partnership clubs located in different countries for their mutual benefit and better understanding. It is designed to assist fellow Y's Men and Women and their families to learn about and exchange ideas between clubs, whether they are just over the border or right across the world". Central Y Service Club has six IBC affiliations four of which form a *quadrangle* relationship, meaning, each is brother club with the other. The quadrangle is made up of Bendigo (Australia) Y Service Club, Northwest Y Service Club (Cupertino, CA), Westchester Y Service Club (Los Angeles) and Central Y Service Club.
