The Kalihi YMCA ASC Campaign has reached \$91% of its campaign goal of \$125,000 as of April 7, 2008. ## Here's to Your Health

**E**ver since the discovery of C-reactive protein (CRP), the blood-borne inflammation indicator, the association between inflammation in the body and heart disease has been firmly established.

Recent research has shown that many other common health problems are also associated with inflammation, such a Alzheimer's disease, arthritis, asthma, diabetes, osteoporosis and even cancer.

Inflammation is the body's natural response to injury, bacteria, viruses and many other foreign agents. It causes tissues to swell, blood vessels to expand and the body to release various chemicals, such as hormones, enzymes and cytokines. This process helps to kill germs and repair tissue in case of injury and, generally, rids the body of bacterial or viral threats. If the invader is cancer, however, these same inflammatory responses can fuel the disease.
