
President's message

Seattle August 22: Jiro and I are preparing to leave Seattle tomorrow after being here with our daughter Kathy's family for 10 days. It included a special musical concert planned by our grandson David's friends to raise funds to cover some of his large medical cost, resulting from a single car accident while driving from Westmont Christian College in Santa Barbara to his home in Seattle, a long 20 hour drive. He was in touch with his family periodically on his cell phone as his parents kept track of his progress. His family's worst fears were realized when they lost contact, causing them to rush down to find him at the trauma center in a San Jose Hospital. The Highway Patrol report had stated that "the driver did not have much chance for survival." He remained in a comatose state for nearly 10 days.

The news of the accident came to us on the early hours of May 18 when we were getting ready to get to the airport

to participate in the Hawaiian Regional Convention at Pagoda Hotel in Honolulu. In the three months since the accident, David has made such rapid recovery that I would consider this no less than a miracle. What contributed to his recovery I think was the early medical attention he received and the excellent care that followed, David's youth and determination, and, most importantly, the many prayers and expressions of concern for his well-being by many people, including many Y's Men who learned about this event and have offered concerns and prayers for him.

On this visit to Seattle, Jiro and I were able to see David in person looking like his former self, sustaining just a slight limp in walking, and had become well enough to get back to Westmont College where, being a relatively small school, the entire faculty and his many friends gave him a big welcome. His mother who drove and remained with him for a couple of days reported that "he couldn't stop smiling."

We thank God for all of his mercy and his loving care as he watches over us.



Y's International

Y's Men International has achieved a new threshold in its membership as of July 1, 2007. Compared to last year, worldwide total membership is now at 30,505, up from 28,504. New clubs and growth in membership is primarily from the European and India Areas.

US Area

U. S. Area Convention, South Carolina, July 12-15, 2007. Although the convention was small in attendance, the fellowship was great. Hawaii **RD Phil Sammer** was awarded the Henry Grimes Award for the club year, 2006-2007. This award is given to the outstanding U.S. Area Regional Director. Club awards were also presented to the Central, Kaimuki, Kalihi, and East Kauai Clubs. Finally, East Kauai member **Donna Schulze** received the Boots Fabian Award, given to former or present YMCA staff for their support of Y's Men and its mission.. She is the first woman member to receive this award. The workshops held emphasized the need to increase club membership and work towards reversing this trend of declining membership in clubs.

BIRDS OF A FEATHER...

Part III

In earlier articles we have focused on rare Hawaiian birds that you may no longer be able to see (some are extinct and others reside in remote mountainous areas where it is inconvenient to try to find them). Today we will feature a bird that is considered endangered but which is often easy to glimpse on Kauai.

The **Nene** (pronounced "nay-nay") or Hawaiian Goose almost went extinct in the last century - the population was down to just a handful of birds. Private individuals and later the government stepped up and preserved these birds and created breeding programs to encourage and protect new hatchlings. The Nene had become devastated by loss of habitat, their desirability as a food source for sailors (and their lack of wariness), the introduction of the mongoose (which found Nene nests to be easy plunder) and nest deprivations by rats and cats.

The Nene is a close relative of the Canada Goose from the North American mainland. Probably hundreds of thousands of years ago some Canada Geese migrated through Hawaii (as they still do today) but some remained on the Hawaiian Islands and evolved separately. Nene do not migrate, are only found in Hawaii and remain in Hawaii year-round.

Nene were once common on all of the islands of Hawaii but now are only found on the major islands and usually only on protected (fenced) refuges (the mongoose is still a threat to them everywhere except Kauai). But

they have been especially successful on Kauai and their population has been growing (in fact Kauai supplies most of the Nene that are used to re-populate the other islands).

Nene can be most easily viewed on the north shore of Kauai (but also found on all other coastlines). They are especially abundant at the Kilauea Lighthouse refuge site (where there is an intensive breeding program) and can also be found in large numbers in the Hanalei taro



fields. Residents also frequently see them on the Princeville golf courses and alongside the highway in newly-mown fields. We have had Nene stroll through our condo complex and even had a small group of Nene curiously follow us as we walked our cat (on a leash) along the golf course.



Nene are distinctly identified by the alternating light/dark feather pattern on their necks (not an actual difference in feather coloration but a light and shadow pattern created by gaps in the way the neck feathers orient).

Kauai is the best place in the world to see Nene in the wild.
