

The Hawaii Region has increased membership based on preliminary reports to date! Awaiting rosters Maui, and gave a verbal total of "no change", the rest of the region reports 12 new members, and a loss of 6 members ... a **NET PLUS SIX!**

CONVENTION PLANNING MEETING

The Convention Planning Committee has been busy with data gathering ... and this time we even had some food gathering as well (at dinner at Sammy's in the Miramar Hotel ... something new to me ... who has never been in the Miramar Hotel.) in August!

Using the Ilima Hotel conference room for discussions, we walked over to the Ohana East Hotel and Miramar Hotel at the intersection of Kaiulani and Kuhio. It was a ten minute walk. The group of twelve (Phil Sammer, Rick Lau, Walter Osakoda, Phil Chun, Donna Saito, Joe-Ann McCarthy, Sharon and Brad Ishida, Maurice Shimonishi, Duke and Linda Chung, and Bob Kuwahara) toured the proposed banquet and meeting facilities.

At the Ohana East Hotel we viewed a banquet room on the first floor with an occupancy limit of 130.

At the Miramar Hotel, we viewed

Banquet room on the first floor with an occupancy limit of 250 (or split in half for 125)

Adjoining room to the restaurant on the fifth floor with an occupancy limit of 90

Parking would be \$3 for five hours (still subject to negotiation for more hours)

We enjoyed dinner at Sammy's on the fifth floor. The special for the night was "furiwake crusted sea bass" and "loco moco" for \$15.50. Very reasonable and great tasting. The garlic steak was also great as reported by those selecting that dish.

Discussion continued on the format and facilities for the convention. A subsequent meeting was held in September to discuss the general program outline.

Right now, we will have the convention during the 3rd weekend in May (weekend before the Memorial Day weekend). We will use the Ilima Hotel for the hotel rooms and possible meetings. Lunches and dinners will be at restaurants or hotels in the walking vicinity. The convention will begin around 11 am on SATURDAY and continue into SUNDAY, with the scheduled program ending Sunday night. Monday will be travel day for the OGV District attendees, with possible options added.

One addition to the committee responsibilities was in the discussion of the development of a DVD to be shown at the convention. Sharon Ishida is the point person, with Russ Lynch gathering the various pictures, and Jesse Castro assisting in the production. It is hoped that the DVD can then be used by clubs as a recruitment and orientation tool.

A tentative schedule has been circulated to discussion at the club meetings prior to the next Metro District meeting on October 22nd, where the committee's proposals will be discussed.

The next convention meeting will be held on November 15th at the Ilima Hotel, following the Region's Mid Year Cabinet Meeting.
