Hawaii Region News -

Convention Planning May Go Statewide

Hawaii clubs are being asked to consider making the organization of the annual Regional Convention a direct function of the statewide body, rather than the responsibility of the district in which it is being held.

Among other things, the change would recognize that there are clubs in Hawaii whose membership is so small that having a convention on their island would be an almost-impossible burden without outside help.

Regional Director **Phil Sammer** recently issued a "talking points" paper for clubs to consider. Phil proposes a vote on the matter in 2008 with the changes to take effect in 2009.

With membership shrinking in the Region, it is getting increasingly difficult for some clubs to handle logistics of conventions on their islands, Phil says.

Under the existing setup, the money needed to set up the convention must come from one district's treasury.

Money taken in from the auctions etc. at the convention currently benefit only one district and cannot be used to balance the Hawaii Region budget, even though all convention attendees contribute, regardless of their home district.

Here's what RD Sammer suggests:

The entire region would participate in convention planning and execution each year.

There will still be Districts and the District Governor would still be the convention chair when the convention is to be held in his or her district. That would work on an alternating basis, starting with Metro District in 2009.

In other words, starting with a convention on Oahu in 2009, the convention chair post would alter-

nate between the district governors of Metro and Orchid-Garden-Vallev.

The convention planning committee could meet on Oahu with the Neighbor Island members being brought in at Region expense.

Money from auctions and "Y's Guy" at the convention would go to the Region, to help defray convention costs and other expenses.

"The plan puts the responsibility for the convention on the entire region every year, rather than one district, and broadens the pool of planners," Phil said.

International News -

New Clubs in India

A flurry of new-club openings in India is boosting Y's Men International at an amazing rate.

So far in 2007 alone, there have been 20 new clubs applying for recognition.

Of those 19 are in India and one is in a new territory for Y's-dom. Kosovo.

Altogether, the 19 clubs signing on in 2007 have about 370 members. There was a similar rate of expansion last year, again largely in India. The total listed on the Y's Men International website is still "almost 1,500 clubs with around 28,000 members in 72 countries on all continents."

We're pretty sure that is out of date but even if it is lower than the most-recent tally, it is impressive, reminding us that we are part of a very big organization indeed.

The U.S. Area, by the way, has about 140 clubs, or less than 10 percent of the world's total.

In total membership, the U.S. clubs list a bit less than 2,200, or less than 8 percent of the world's total. India alone has about one-third of the world's membership.


